

## Checklist for Card Type, Number or Expiration Date Changes

This Checklist applies for the change from VISA Debit Cards to MasterCard EMV Chip Debit cards as well as any future card type, number or expiration date changes to your card.

Here's what to do when the card type, number or expiration date changes on your debit card:

- Activate your new card as soon as you get it in the mail.
- Update your new card information with all merchants that bill your card automatically.
- Review the activity on your checking account statements to identify other one-time or recurring payments processed using your debit card.
- Common recurring transactions are listed below.
- Household and Business Expenses
  - Utilities – Gas – Water – Electric – Trash Removal -
  - TV/Cable/Internet
    - Examples: Comcast – Verizon – ATT - Direct TV – Netflix – Amazon – Red Box – Blockbuster
  - Home/Mobile Phone
    - Examples – Verizon – Comcast – Sprint -
  - Insurance: Life – Car – Homeowners – Renters – Medical/Rx
  - Rent: Apartment -
  - Music Subscriptions – Amazon® – iTunes® – Sirius XM® Radio – Spotify –
  - Credit Card Payments – Visa – MasterCard – American Express – Discover
- Internet Services
  - Amazon.com® - Amazon® Kindle - iTunes® - Google Checkout® - Samsung Pay
  - Online Retail Stores/Clubs
  - Metro/Bus/Toll Booth or EZ Passes
  - Online Shopping – QVC – HSN – Shopping Network
- Services and Subscriptions
  - Gym, Pool or Club Memberships
  - School Tuition/ Food Programs
  - Newspaper/Magazine Subscriptions
  - Pharmacy Prescriptions
  - Big Box Store membership: Costco – Sam's Club – BJ's
- IMPORTANT REMINDER: Securely destroy all debit cards with the old card number or expiration date.
